NEW PROGRAM UPDATE: HARM REDUCTION

What is Harm Reduction? Harm reduction includes a range of health, social services, and safe practices that apply to substance use.


Harm reduction is an approach that aims to minimize the risks associated with behaviors people are unable or unwilling to stop engaging in. A common example of harm reduction in everyday life is the use of a seatbelt while riding or driving in a car. People who use drugs can use harm reduction practices to decrease the risks drugs pose to their lives and their bodies. Something as simple as an isopropyl alcohol pad can save a life by preventing infections associated with injection drug use.

NEW PROGRAM UPDATE: YOUTH PROGRAMMING




Jeff Randolph (he/him)
